Reducing Your Footprint

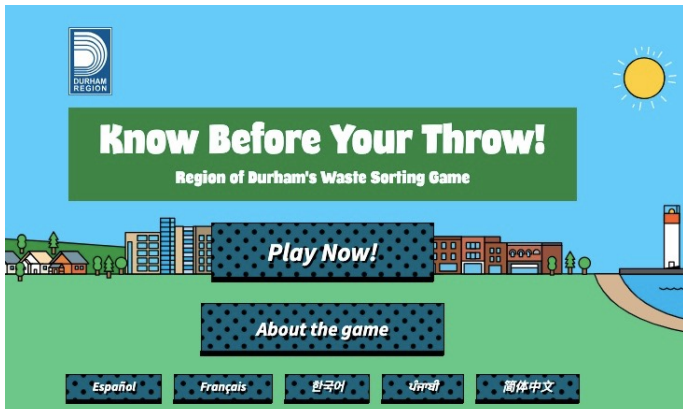
A New Way to Play Online (Report by Jen Thorson)

All of us, at one time or another, have been unsure as to what to recycle, what to compost, or whether an item must become landfill. Durham Region has a terrific online tool called Know Before You Throw, easily accessed by searching Durham Waste Management, then clicking on Garbage and Recycling, and finally the KBYT option. It's easy to get caught up in searching not only everyday items but oddball ones as well. Did you know that tin foil goes in our "containers" blue box... but so does a metal cookie tin? A cardboard/fibre egg carton or drink tray belongs in our green bin, as do paper takeout food containers! Any thermal paper (shiny, with a smooth feel, like most cash register receipts or lottery tickets) goes into the garbage, as the coating is a contaminant. Plain paper ones are fine for recycling. And reusable grocery sacks, along with Vince's (yes, the tool specifies "Vince's") biodegradable grocery bags, are garbage! Textiles can live on as shredded insulation, while bedding and towels can be donated to animal shelters/sanctuaries/ vet offices.



In this age of waste and thoughtlessness, let's be better than that and do it right. There's so much great information on this site- we invite you to play and learn. Here's the link:
