

Wednesday, November 26, 2024



Reducing Your Footprint

DOES A GREEN LIFE STYLE INCLUDE COOKING BY INDUCTION?

What is it? Different than traditional radiant heat cooking, induction uses

electromagnetism and transfers energy directly to the pan and food.

Which stovetop type is best?







Electric



Induction Most energy efficie

Pros? Direct energy to food means fast cooking.

Remove the pan, the reaction stops and the heating process stops. Induction should mean less energy expended than electric or gas stoves. No open flames or hot cooktops means greater safety. No risk of setting fire to anything on the stove. Less risk of burns for children, pets or seniors. Since the cook top doesn't get hot, spills should be easier to clean up.

Cons? Induction stoves tend to be more expensive to buy. Specialised cookware with high iron content is required which is an added cost depending on your current cookware. You cannot cook with induction if you lose power. This is an advantage with gas stoves but the same with traditional stoves. There may be a learning curve in terms of your cooking style due to the speed of heating lower settings and watch your timing. The pot or pan cannot be off-centre, too small or unstable. The cookware must be dead centre to activate the magnetic field.

Is an induction cooktop for you? Like anything else, you need to understand what you get and what you give up when you opt for an induction cooktop. (Report by Brett Moore)
