
First let me thank all our House Committee Helpers for a job well done in October at the new site. We were able to see what worked and what needs some adjustments for November.

# Updating Our By-Laws

As mentioned at the October General Meeting, we will be holding a vote at next week's meeting to update the Club's By-Laws. Every few years, PROBUS Canada reviews and updates its Constitution and ensures their By-Laws reflect the new Constitution.

Each of the local chapters MUST adopt the standard Constitution for PROBUS Clubs (so no need for a vote there) and review their own By-Laws to match the changes within 90 days. Along with Linda Abate and Kathy Clulow, I have been revising our own By-Laws. The original Constitution and By-Laws for the Club are posted on our website and the revised By-Law were e-mailed to you October 11. At our November meeting, we will be voting to accept the following motion:

I propose a motion that the Probus Club of Uxbridge, accept the proposed changes to the bylaws of the Probus Club of Uxbridge, which reflect the updated constitution from Probus Canada, dated July, 2023, as presented at this general meeting of October 11, 2023, representing 30 days notice to our members, and such motion to be put forward for voting on November 8, 2023.

Under existing By-Law 6-4:

Any motion for which the Club membership shall be requested to vote shall be first submitted in writing to the Secretary. The motion will be read at the General Meeting one month prior to the General Meeting when Club members will vote. This notice shall also be communicated by an email, an announcement in the Club newsletter and/or on the Club website, at least fourteen days prior to the General Meeting when the motion is to be presented.

This notice is to inform you of the Motion and it has also appeared on our website and in the email dated October 11.

The changes to the existing By-Laws are minor. Here is a summary:

- Bylaw 1 Territory to permit a 2nd club in the same territory if the membership exceeds the capacity
- Bylaw 2 Membership & Fees to include the actual initiation & membership fees
- Bylaw 3 Management Team to include "staggered terms", inclusion of House Chair as optional team position, inclusion of meetings shall be held monthly.
- Bylaw 4 Election of Management Team minor wording
- Bylaw 5 Club Officers minor wording (change Past President to Immediate Past President)
- Bylaw 6 General & Annual Meetings to include ability to postpone meetings in case of inclement weather, public health emergency or safety concerns
- Bylaw 7 Financial No change
- Bylaw 8 Profitability to include bylaw that says we must pay our bills

Bylaw 9 Assets - No change

Bylaw 10 Amendments - No change

In October, over forty of our members visited the Salem Alpaca Farm in Manilla, and learned about these fascinating animals. They are related to llamas, and like them, from South America, but are smaller and apparently less obstreperous in nature. Here in Ontario they are raised for their wool, and shorn every spring. By



October, as you can see from the pictures, they have grown a good deal of it back. The wool is used in clothing and duvet stuffing, and is exceptionally soft, warm and hypoallergenic. Salem also operates a gift shop and a number of Christmas gifts were purchased.



# ARE RECEIPTS RECYCLABLE?

#### DID YOU KNOW?

It may come as a surprise, but many cash register receipts are not recyclable! Most receipts today use thermal paper, which is coated with a dye and a developer. Heat from the printer makes the letters and numbers appear.



#### What's the problem?

BPA and BPS are the developers used in thermal paper. BPA was banned in food and drink containers as it was linked to several serious diseases. BPA and BPS are "forever chemicals" so they never will break down in the environment.

Tossing these receipts in our paper recycling contaminates the good paper products with BPA and BPS. These contaminants will be in any new products made from the recycled paper. Composting them would cause the chemicals to leach into the soil.

#### How do I tell the difference?

Thermal receipts – look "shiny", feel softer. Examples: receipts from ATMs, gas pumps, stores and lottery tickets. Thermal paper receipts should go in the garbage. Regular paper receipts – are "crisper", have paler ink, are not shiny, feel dull. Receipts

printed (or handwritten) on regular paper are fully recyclable.

#### What else can I do?

Have receipts emailed to you, or decline them if it makes sense.


## BANNED BOOK CLUB: Coordinator Camille Scarlett One spot left!







