

IS COMING NOVEMBER 2024



Reducing Your Footprint

CHRISTMAS TREES - REAL OR ARTIFICIAL? (Report by Debra Lippay)

CAMP REAL: Oh, before you get all "they're messy and dangerous", hear me out. Messy - hey, so is life! Is it not fun finding tree needles in July? Danger from fire - yes, if it's dry and sitting next to the fireplace - or candles. Before consumerism took hold, trees didn't go up as early. Decorating now starts exactly one minute after the pumpkins disappear. Farming is green, right? Monoculture tree farming is not participating in any kind of biodiversity or natural ecosystem in our environment, and often chemicals are used in growing the trees. But trees absorb carbon from the air, you say? A little, but



tree farms cut down the trees before they are really big enough to start absorbing that carbon. And what distance is the tree being shipped?



CAMP ARTIFICIAL: They don't drop needles - unless of course the cat gets in there - but what are they made of? PVC. Yup and you can't get rid of that stuff, it's difficult to recycle. Into the landfill they go. You can keep them for years, although consumerism dictates bigger, newer, shinier - so, are they? Where are they made? Certainly not by your local small business. Mostly they are shipped from factories overseas. Emissions from shipping are scary.

Which camp are you in? There isn't a clear winner here, but leaning real; be conscious of where you purchase. Support small local business who are environmentally aware. Our municipalities recycle them! Or leave your tree outside after Christmas, providing shelter for birds and small creatures! Then compost come spring.




WINE CLUB: Coordinators Sherrill Burns & Anne Gauvreau
