PROBUS COVID PROTOCOLS

After fifteen months of various levels of quarantine because of the COVID-19 pandemic, we are all ready for some in-person time, and that is what PROBUS is all about. Thanks to the hugely successful vaccination programme, the restrictions on gatherings are gradually being lifted, and we can start planning the first steps in a return to normal behaviour.

We are a private seniors club and as such, need to manage the risk of the return to normal in our members. Given our ages, it is imperative that safety be our highest priority, and therefore your management team has formulated the following policy:

For the foreseeable future, **in-person gatherings will require all participants to be fully vaccinated.** This includes our monthly meetings and any social events or interest group activities that are indoors or on buses. This is how it will work:

When you were vaccinated, you received a Ministry of Health receipt. When you attend your first in-person event, bring this note with you. We will record its existence, and you will not need to show it any more to us. The Social Committee Chair and Interest Group Coordinator will be notified of this and will be able to plan their events safely.

The easiest way to get the checkmark beside your name is to email your receipt to Gail Porter Heroux at social.uxbridgeprobus@gmail.com or Elaine Stevenson at uxbridgeprobus@gmail.com, or bring it to be seen the first time you come out. If you decide not to be vaccinated, you may continue to attend any Zoom events that may occur but will not be able to attend in person. If you are unable to receive the vaccine for health reasons, please speak to someone on the Management Team, and we will make every effort to accommodate you. In any case provincial guidelines in effect at the time will prevail, as to group size, distancing and mask requirements, etc. If you have any questions, please feel free to email me at chuckheroux@gmail.com, and I will try to answer them.


and...
